When was the Great Fire of London?



The fire started in Pudding Lane in 1666.



1666 is approximately 350 years ago.



Samuel Pepys wrote in his diary about it.



The fire spread very quickly.



Many buildings were destroyed.



The fire was finally put out 4 days later.

What was London like before the Great Fire of London?



Houses were made of wood and straw and pitch.



Houses were built very close together.



People used fire for heating, lighting and cooking.



Hygiene was poor and the plague killed thousands of people.



There was no fire service and no fire engines.

Why did the fire cause so much destruction?



Houses made of flammable materials burnt easily.



Houses built close together allowed the fire to spread.



London was full of sheds filled with hay and straw.



It had been a long hot summer with very little rain.



It was very windy when the fire started.

The fire helped to get rid of the plague.




The first fire brigade was established.
