What a year we have had! We are very proud of how far we have come on our OPAL journey and we are looking forward to continuing to enhance and develop play at Brookside. This half term we have enjoyed lots of 'green welly' days on the field and taking our shoes and socks off in the sandpit!

Nature Project supported by Saint Gobain

We have now welcomed two working parties from Saint Gobain to continue to build biodiversity, habitat creation and planting at Brookside as part of a funded Nature project. They have planted hedgerows, installed a bird hide (2 more have been purchased and will be built in the Autumn), created some bug homes, sown wildflower seeds, built bird boxes, planted trees, bluebells and wild garlic and built hedgehog houses. This is a long term project and we are excited about what is to come. The top corner of the field by the sandpit mound is our first 'wild' area. The grass is to be left to grow with wildflowers, a small woodland (which has been planted using the Miyawaki technique), bird boxes and a hedgehog house. As soon as the ground has settled we will open up the area to the children.

Our plans for the next phase include planting more trees and opening up and clearing out our pond area. If you have any pond management expertise, or know anyone who has, please let us know! We also plan to create a nature/sensory garden next to the bungalow. We will keep you posted on all developments.

Fundraising

Our 'Break the Rules' day this half term raised nearly £400. We are going to buy some waterproof trousers of varying sizes but we have also already bought some hammock chairs for the children to use in quiet areas.

We will continue to fundraise for OPAL next term (some children have already suggested some new fundraising ideas!) and we really appreciate all your support.







Rangers

We are pleased to have enrolled many of our Year 5 children to be OPAL Rangers. They support children in their play, help to tidy and take photos of great things! The children always choose whether they want to be a Ranger that day, and they could just do it for 5 or 10 minutes at a time. The children just collect a cap when they want to be a Ranger.





Summer Holiday clear-out

Over the summer break, if you are having a clear-out, please keep OPAL in mind! We always need loose parts to enhance the play for our children. Don't worry about things being in perfect condition, we will check items over thoroughly before making them available to the children.
