Introducing Stuart Adey



I am delighted to have joined the Governing Body at Brookside School as a Parent Governor. It is an exciting place to be where success is celebrated and shared and the school is never standing still. I've received a warm welcome from my fellow governors and been brought up to speed on many of the exciting things which are going on at school.

I live in East Leake with my wife and four young children. My oldest child is in Year One at Brookside and the others will follow in her footsteps when the time comes. I feel very fortunate to

There has been a huge amount of interest and we have no doubt that this will be a huge success!

The recruitment process for his successor has been completed and Jenny Cooke, Executive Head of Cropwell Bishop Primary School and Burton Joyce Primary School, has been successfully appointed. Termly Focus

We are required to complete Nottingham County Council's Safeguarding Audit and the Child Protection and Confidential File Audit on an annual basis. Both are carried out by our Designated Safeguarding Leads, Mr Kenny and Miss Pip, and overseen by Safeguarding Governors, Reesha Armstead and Lewis James. The purpose of the audits is to ensure that all safeguarding and child protection systems are in place, that processes are properly followed and that full and detailed records are kept. During our recent OFSTED Inspection, the Inspector referred to our attention to safeguarding and child protection as 'meticulous and forensic' in detail.

Our Link Governors have had a busy term. Reports on Local Governing Body Development, Performance Management, Pupil Progress, the Curriculum, OPAL Play, and Health and Safety have been submitted to both the Governing Body and Equals Trust.
